TRANSITIONS

David Hull

I like these words from Marlene Kropf, a professor at the Associated Mennonite Biblical Seminary:

In the daily round of life, dust and cobwebs accumulate in our souls. The hidden corners of our hearts become encrusted with grime or filled with forgotten debris. During the weeks of Lent, God's Spirit is given opportunity to clear away the clutter, sweep away the dust and wash us clean. We are invited to prepare ourselves—heart, soul, mind, and body—for the new life of Easter.

Do you have any dust and cobwebs in your soul? Is there grime encrusted in the hidden corners of your heart? If so, the season of Lent offers a concentrated time for some spiritual spring cleaning. I encourage you to join with us for the special worship events during this season with the prayer that these experiences will prepare you for the new life of Easter.

The Season of Lent begins on March 2 and ends the day before Easter. Lent marks the season in the Christian Year when we make the journey with our Lord to the cross. It is a time when we focus on the suffering, sacrifice, passion, and redemption that Jesus offered through the cross. Through prayer, repentance, Bible reading, worship, and reflection on the death of our Lord we can let the Spirit of God mark us in a way that we will bear some identification as followers of Jesus. Others will see Jesus in us, because of the way our lives conform to our Lord. We can also let this same Spirit of God clean out some of the dust and cobwebs in our souls. This is why we observe Lent.

On the cover of this newsletter you will see a schedule of Lenten Luncheons with the Main Street churches. I hope that you can participate with our friends in these churches as we make this journey to the cross together. Then, on three Sundays during March we will explore a series called "Gospel."
