From Our Pastor...

Many years ago, when I began shopping for Rebecca's engagement ring, I thoroughly researched diamonds. I learned that they are the hardest substance on the planet. I learned that they are rare. And, of course, I learned that they are beautiful. The way light is refracted to create beautiful sparkles mesmerizes us all. All these things give diamonds value. However, jewelers have a more technical way to determine value. They are cut, clarity, carat and color. The shape of the diamond, the purity of the diamond, the size of the diamond and the color of the diamond contribute to the value of the diamond.

Some things are valuable because they are rare and beautiful. Other things are valuable because they are valuable to us. Both Rebecca and I still possess a stuffed animal from our preschool days. While they would sell for less than a dollar at a thrift store, they are priceless to us because of what they meant to us as children. Rebecca gave me a Fossil watch for my first birthday we celebrated together in 1999. The watch kept good time until 2018. It was the only watch that I would wear. A pawn shop may have given me five dollars for it, but it was priceless to me.

How do we measure the value of a church? Is a church valuable because of how many people attend? Is it valuable because of its programming? What about facilities?

In the first few weeks that I've had the privilege to serve you as your pastor, I've met some wonderful people. I have been in awe at the quality of our Christian Education and Music programs, along with our ministries to children and youth. Our resources have captivated my imagination for opportunities to minister.

All these things (and more) are important. Yet, our value comes from the One who created this community from "every tribe, tongue, race and language." Our value comes from God because, by His Spirit, we are His people. As such, we have value. We are valuable simply for being. The church has intrinsic value.

While we are valuable because God has brought us into existence, we are also valuable because God has called us to join Him in His mission to reach the world for Jesus Christ. As David Platt has said, "The church is God's Plan A and there is no Plan B!" We are the ones through whom Christ is made known. We share the message of Jesus verbally and through our deeds. The world sees Christ and experiences Christ through us.

Years ago, First Baptist Church adopted the vision statement, "Bringing joy to the heart of God and bringing Christ to the people of Laurens." The former testifies to our church's intrinsic value. We are valuable simply for being. The latter testifies to our church's instrumental value. We are valued for our role in God's mission. I hope that you will join us for worship this October as we remember our value as God's people!
