Dear Church Family and Friends,

"Father, the hour has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you. For you granted him authority over all people that he might give eternal life to all those you have given him. Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent." (John 17:1-3, NIV)

Eternal life. It's impossible to imagine sometimes. Life that extends beyond the grave. But, more than that, life that extends much longer and further than we can possibly comprehend.

However, in Jesus' day and in John's gospel, eternal life is so much more than just the duration of life. Living forever can be just as scary as the idea of not living forever, especially if life is difficult, filled with pain and hopelessness. Many people have and continue to experience life such as this. No, this is not the gift that Jesus gives to us.

Have you ever been to the Zoo? Rebecca and I were talking the other day that it might be fun to visit the Greenville Zoo. When we lived in Elon, we visited the Asheboro, North Carolina, Zoo frequently. While we can see animals like elephants, polar bears, and alligators in books, we cannot observe them like we can at the Zoo. There, we watch them eat, walk, play with their young and do things that they enjoy. A Zoo is a place where we may observe the quality of an animal species' life. The Greek word translated "life" in this passage is zoe, from which the science "zoology" is named. The name for a girl, Zoe, that has become more common in recent years, also comes from this Greek word. Its definition is more than just life processes. It's the good life or thriving life.

But then there is also this word we translate "eternal." The Greek word is an adjective, just like the English word. But it has another meaning besides "forever." Have you ever observed a point where life has really changed? The invention of the smart phone and its consequent popularity in the past fifteen years has changed life forever. For me, it was the advent of computers. Beginning in college, I learned how to use a computer, send email, connect to the internet. It was something new. For me, in 1996, at college, my life entered a new "era" as I learned to use a PC. The Greek word aionion, which is the adjectival form of the noun aion, is best translated "era" or "age."

Jews in Jesus' time, along with Jesus and his followers, understood life in two ages. This age is the present

age, filled with evil, suffering, personal sin, and death. Yet, when Jesus returns and sin and death are eliminated, we will enter the age to come.

Thus, "eternal life" is life that best possesses the quality of the age to come. It is also something that we may experience now, even if it is for moments.

During April, we celebrated Easter and the promises Jesus' resurrection have brought to our lives and to our world. As we move into May, remember the wonderful gift that we have been given. We've been given a life of love. We have been given a life of purpose. We have been given a relationship with God. And, we have been given the opportunity to share all this with others.

As we prepare for Vacation Bible School, honor our high school graduates, remember the dear people who have gone to be with the Lord during this past year, as we honor the women in our church and as we receive the offering for the South Carolina Ministry to the Aging, may we remember that our participation in these is a participation in the eternal kind of life here and now, in this present age. We can have tomorrow's life today. We can brighten it. Will you join us as we worship, serve, and grow?
