It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. (Galatians 5:1, NIV)

Independence Day was always one of my favorite days growing up! Each July 4, my dad would wake up early in the morning to get the fire started on his oil drum grill. He would barbecue multiple slabs of ribs. Sometimes he would add chicken. But we loved the ribs. I do not know how he did it, but he could cook them so tender that the meat would almost fall off the bone.

We always invited family. Each year was different. But my mom's cousin, Jean, and her husband, David, along with their family would come for lunch. Uncle David, as we called him, brought his freezer and made homemade vanilla ice cream. It was so flavorful that we never wanted anything besides vanilla. It was always a good day.

But we gathered to celebrate the birth of our country. It was founded on freedom. The founding fathers of this country believed that all people had the right to forge their own destiny, to be free from tyranny, and to cooperate to form a great nation.

But what is freedom for? Paul speaks of freedom as well. However, he is not concerned with political tyranny. No, Paul is concerned with freedom from the demands of a rigorous law, which, as he argues, does not bring salvation to begin with. As he argues this, though, he provides the purpose of freedom. It is to love – that is, to will the good of others. For Paul, nothing holds us back from creating an environment, a community, and a future filled with goodness.

But we need something in our lives for that to happen. God's Holy Spirit desires to remove anger, selfish desires, and destructive habits. The Holy Spirit produces love, joy, peace, and the like.

This month, I hope that you will join us for two important mini sermon series. The first, Let Freedom Ring, addresses how God's Holy Spirit shapes us to enjoy true freedom. The second, Mental Health Matters, discusses the importance of talking about mental in the context of church, with the goals of healing and hope.

While I know that we are in and out during the summer, I hope that you will prioritize worship, either in person or online, as we listen for the God's Word in matters of freedom and mental health!
